

Pride and prejudice is an 1813
romantic novel by Jane Austen. It
charts the emotional development of
Elizabeth Bennet, who learns the error
of making hasty judgements and comes
to appreciate the difference between
the facets of reality and the truth deep
within. Jane Austen paints a sharp and
amusing picture of English life in the
early nineteenth century. It is probably
her most popular novel, partly because

of the character of Elizabeth, whom Austen said was her own favorite heroine.

Most of the story is told from Elizabeth's point of view, and We the readers share her feelings about the other characters. As we read about her experiences from her point of view, we share both her earlier prejudices and her progress to correct moral judgement. While we read the enjoyable and amusing story, we also are being taught the moral lesson that thoughtlessness and irresponsibility lead to unhappiness, whereas selfcontrol and a readiness to improve one's moral understanding bring success and happiness.

What's the pronunciation? (A simple classroom game)

- 4. Tell the teams to confer on the correct word and to pick a spokesperson
- 5. Ask each team's spokesperson what the correct pronunciation is
- 6. Mark on a piece of paper if it's right or not
- 7. After each team has given its guess, allot points on the board to the teams that pronounced the word well
- 8. Continue with the next word.
